

ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY

Australian Offshore Solutions (AOS) recognises a healthy environment as being paramount and as such is committed to operate in an environmentally responsible manner at all times. AOS key policy principles:

- Operate to a standard that meets International Management Standard ISO 14001:2015 and the International Convention for the Prevention of Pollution from Ships (MARPOL), and other applicable local, national and international regulatory requirements.
- A commitment from Senior Management to the protection of the environment, including prevention of pollution, and other specified requirements as set out within this policy.
- Set key objectives for the Company that are appropriate for the organisation and aligns with its strategic direction.
- Through cooperation with Clients, contractors and suppliers in the utilisation of the latest environmental technology, challenge us to attain higher environmental standards than legislative requirements.
- Train all personnel in performing safe operations, emergency response and recovery actions.
- Enforce stringent hazard and risk identification, assessment, mitigation and reporting through Job Safety Analysis (JSA), Permits to Work (PTW) and other such systems.
- Minimise the impact of our activities on the environment by continuously striving to reduce and optimize consumption of fuel and energy and thereby reduce emissions to the air.
- By continuous monitoring, analysis of environmental key performance indicators and open communication with all stakeholders, strive for continuous improvement in our environmental performance.
- Ensure that waste generation is minimised, that no waste except food waste is discharged to sea and that all waste is segregated before delivery to an onshore receiving facility.
- With respect to waste management, the relevant vessel Garbage Management Plan and MARPOL 73/78 Annex V must be complied with at all times.
- All personnel are encouraged to exercise their right to stop work (Stop Work Authority) should they deem a certain situation or work activity creates an imminent risk to personnel health and safety or has the potential to have an adverse impact on the environment.
